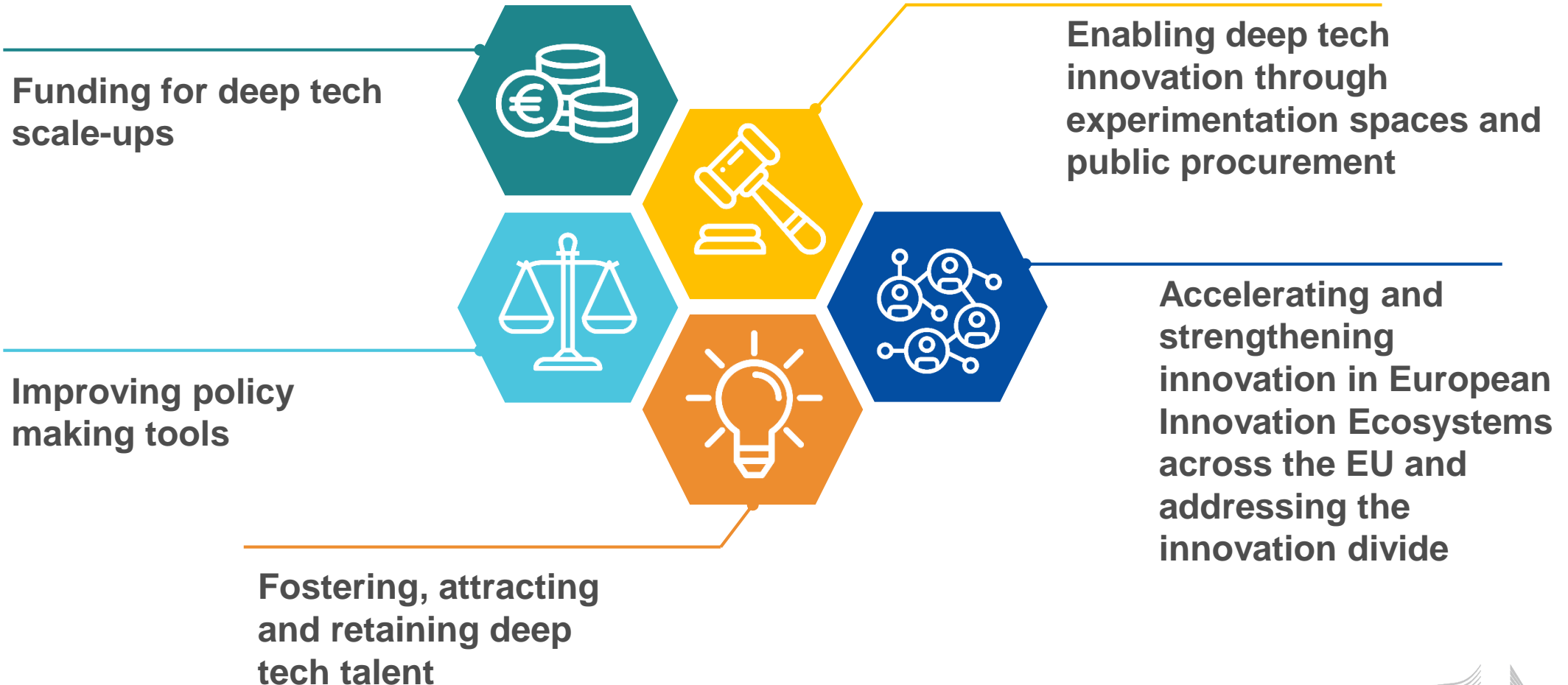

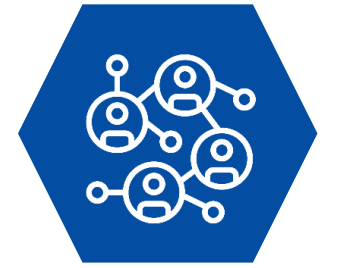

Objective

Create **connected regional innovation valleys**, involving regions with lower innovation performances, by building on strategic areas of regional strength and specialisation, in support of key EU priorities
